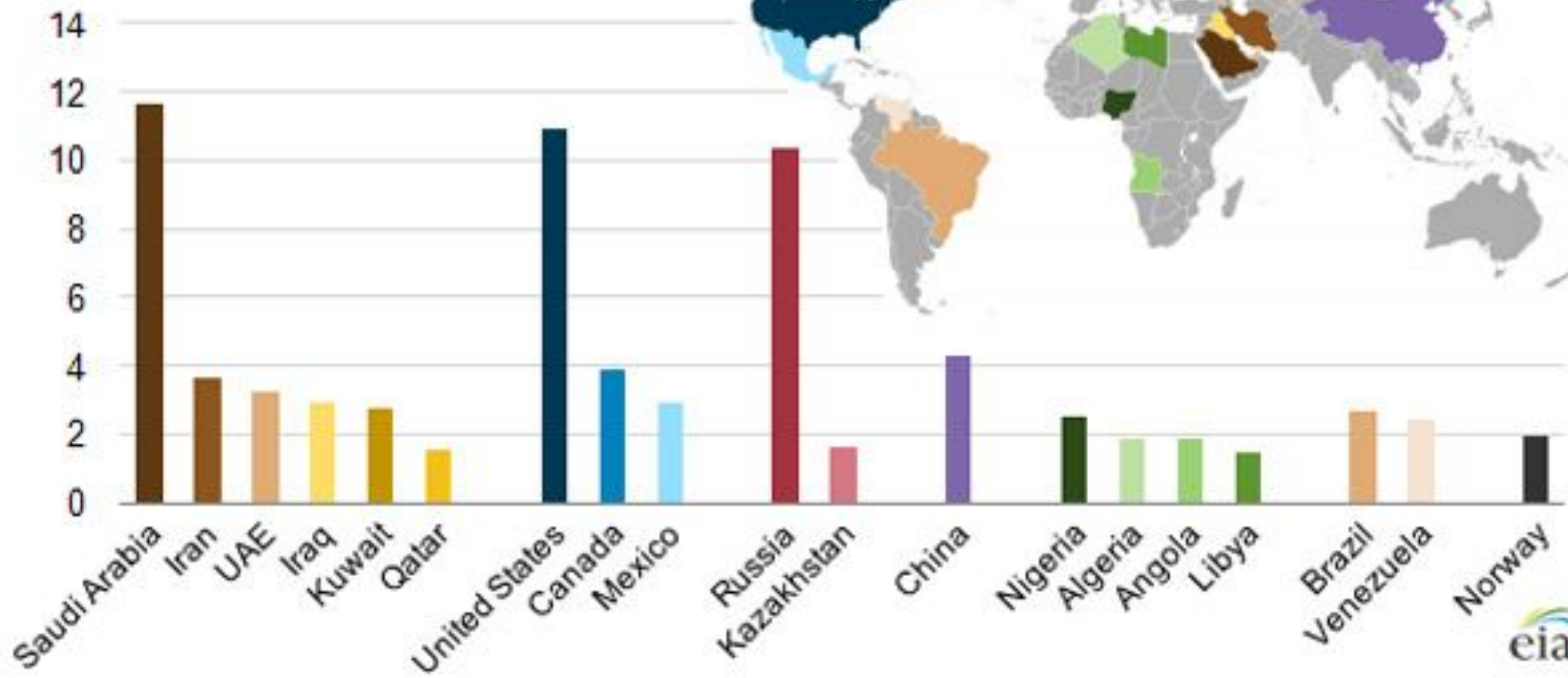

Distribution of Wealth
