North America's National Parks: Creating an Advertisement!

There are 2 options for your ad:

- 1) A folded brochure (see examples)
- 2) A Piktochart

Basic Requirements:

-Large title

-Catch phrase: ex, Welcome to the Grand Canyon! Get Ready to have a GRAAAND Time!

-Location of park: draw a simple map, include the state/province and country.

-Size of the park

-History: When and how did this become a park? Minimum of 3-4 sentences.

-Climate & Vegetation (look at the maps in the back of Geography Alive!)

-3 things to see while visiting the park

-3 things to do while visiting the park

-3 Pictures with captions: hand drawn, printed, or internet

-Minimum of 3 citations: you must list all of the sources you use, including the pictures!

[Pre-AP World Geo must also include 5 other miscellaneous facts about Park)

Task Master-	Art Director-
